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WHY RECYCLE GLASS?

Saves raw materials —



More than 1 ton of natural resources are conserved for every ton of of glass recycled.

Resources conserved include:

1,300 lbs. Sand

Lessens the demand for energy —

410 lbs. Soda Ash

380 lbs. Limestone 160 lbs. Feldspar



Energy costs drop about 2-3% for every 10% cullet used.

Cuts CO2 emissions —



For every six tons of recycled container glass used, a ton of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas, is reduced. A relative 10% increase in cullet reduces particulates by 8%, nitrogen oxide by 4%, and sulfur oxides by 10%.

No processing by-products —



Glass recycling is a closed-loop system, creating no additional waste or by-products.

IT CREATES JOBS!



An estimated 8 jobs per 1,000 tons recycled.



USES FOR RECYCLED GLASS

- Container and Fiberglass Manufacturers
 - Purchase over 3.2 million tons of recycled glass annually.
 - 80% goes back to new bottles
 - Recycled glass extends their furnace life and saves energy costs
- Abrasives/Sandblasting Material
- Aggregate
- Reflective Beads
- Daily Cover

GLASS RECYCLING RATES

- Glass can be recycled endlessly with no loss in quality or purity!
- Recycling by container type:
 In 2014, glass was recycled at these rates:

40% Glass beer & soft drink bottles

32% Wine & liquor bottles

15%

Food jars

Percentage of all glass containers that are recycled:

32.5% National Average

80% California

In some states, like California, glass bottle recycling percentages soar because of deposit laws.



CONVENIENCE VS. RECOVERY

Not all glass recycling is the same!

Out of the three common ways to collect glass for recycling, ONLY ONE has a 98% recovery rate.
