# Establishing Drop-off Location


#### Initially...

- Limited ability to modify the area (e.g. installing signs)


#### Now...

- New locations are more permanent and better maintained







- Roll off containers are rotated between properties each week.




#### **Obstacles:**

- Change in ownership








#### FY2016

- Recycled Material (Residential) = 10,083 tons
- Apartment Recycling Program = 1.17% of total



# **Future Changes**



- Change the City's Code of Ordinances to include multi-family home residents as residential recycling customers.
- Permanently place dumpsters or roll off containers at each property
- Additional Senior Refuse Collector
- Communication with residents and landowners


